# Communication & Language

- To develop their vocabulary through both adult interactions and through stories, having back and forth conversations with others.
- To learn and use new vocabulary in their conversations and play
  - To develop a love of reading
- To be able to make up their own stories

#### **PSED**

- To develop a positive approach to learning and finding out about the world around them
- To be happy and settled showing high levels of involvement in their learning
- To be respectful of each other, the environment and resources in it.
- To develop independence in self-help skills, accessing the environment and planning their own learning.
- To develop in the characteristics of Effective Learning – persevering, finding solutions to problem etc.

## **Physical Development**

- To develop their gross motor skills using strength, balance and coordination to run, jump, hop, skip, climb and dance confidently and safely
- To develop fine motor skills, holding a pencil, paintbrush and other tools effectively and with control
  - To form some letters correctly

### **Literacy**

- To be able to read books containing words they can decode and talk about what they have read.
- To write sentences for a purpose

#### **Maths**

- To be able to perceptually and conceptually subitise amounts in order to develop number sense and calculation skills.
- Developing strong foundations in number skills to support them in Key stage 1.
  - To recognise numbers 1 to 10
  - To write most numbers to 10.

### <u>UTW</u>

- To have a deeper understanding of the changing seasons.
  - To have experience of planting, growing, looking after plants and harvesting fruits and vegetables
    - To explore and have some understanding of life cycles
  - To develop a sense of community
- To begin to put together ideas about past and present
